Coyotes rely on their keen senses to survive. The coyote has the ability to eat anything it can chew and is a cunning hunter and an opportunistic scavenger. It will eat anything, including road kill! It can eat insects,

rabbits, voles, mice, shrews, frogs, squirrels, woodchucks, vegetables, blueberries, apples, watermelon, tomatoes, corn, nuts, carrion, chickens and cats and tiny dogs that are left outside alone. They can even catch fish. It also looks for open garbage cans and cat/dog food left outside.

One type of coyote communication is vocalization and the coyote has an entire repertoire of sounds with each sound having a specific meaning. There is the woof, the growl, the bark, the howl, the yip, the whine, the huff, and various combinations of these, such as the bark howl, the group howl or the magnificent love duet.

Coyotes mate for life and it is the alphas of the pack/family that breed. Approximately six pups are born in April/May and the females are good mothers with the other adults humoring the pups.

As humans move into their habitat, the coyote has been forced to find new places to live. It has become a versatile animal out of necessity.

Coyotes are a part of our natural world. They not only keep the rodent population in check, they help to inhibit disease and their presence encourages other groups of animals.

## Things to See & Do in Dayton

**The Wright Cycle Company** (16 South Williams Street, Dayton, Ohio. 937-225-7705. **Free Admission**)

The fourth bicycle shop operated by the Wrights is the only building remaining as testament to the bicycle business. It is also in this shop in which the Wrights' passive interest in flying turned to active research and development. Designated a National Historic Landmark in 1990. **Free Admission**

**Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center** (16 South Williams, Dayton, Ohio. 937-225-7705. **Free Admission**)

Wilbur and Orville started their careers as printers and operated their second print shop, outside the home, here as Wright & Wright Job Printers. In this location, the Wrights edited and published newspapers for the West Side patrons. The Dayton Tattler, written by Paul Laurence Dunbar, was also printed at this location. Designated as part of the West Third Street National Register Historic District in 1988. **Free Admission**

**Huffman Prairie Flying Field** (Gate 16A, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base)

On this 84-acre patch of rough pasture outside Dayton, the Wright brothers learned to control and maneuver their powered machine and taught themselves to fly during 1904 and 1905. The Flying Field is located on an active military installation and subject to unannounced closure. Visitors are urged to call 937-425-0008 for field closures. **Free Admission**

**Huffman Prairie Flying Field Interpretive Center** (2380 Memorial Road, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base)

Exhibits focus on the Wright brothers' development of the world's first practical airplane at Huffman Prairie in 1904 and 1905, their flying school starting in 1910, and the accomplishments of Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. **Free Admission**

**Wright Memorial** (2380 Memorial Road, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base)

Adjacent to the Interpretive Center, the Wright Memorial on Wright Brothers Hill is a 27-acre designed landscape honoring Dayton's native sons. The monument was dedicated on August 19, 1940, Orville's 69th birthday. **Free Admission**

**Wright Brothers Aviation Center at Carillon Park** (1000 Carillon Boulevard, Dayton, Ohio)

The world's first practical airplane, the 1905 Wright Flyer III, built by the Wright brothers and flown at Huffman Prairie, is the centerpiece exhibit. Designated a National Historic Landmark in 1990 and a Historic Mechanical Engineering Landmark in 2003.

**Paul Laurence Dunbar House** (219 North Paul Laurence Dunbar Street)

Home of the prolific writer Paul Dunbar from 1904-1906. Dunbar produced over 400 poems, novels, plays, short stories, and lyrics during his lifetime. Designated a National Historic Landmark in 1977. The Dunbar House is open for walk-up visitation every Friday and Saturday from 10a.m. until 4p.m. **\$6 Adults, \$3 Students**

**National Air Force Museum** (1100 Spaatz Street, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base)
